- Reported that there were a few budget lines that need amending that were slightly overdrawn.
- Asked permission to transfer \$ 29,509.84 from Water Checking to Reserve for Debt Service for future Capital improvements in water system. This is in excess from Debt Service Collections and Bond Payment due to Refinance Grant August 2017.
- Reported that received Unemployment request on a couple of employees that were determined to be part of a fraud scheme that was determined by NYS. It was not initiated by our employees.
- Unemployment insurance will be reimbursing us for overpayment on Amanda Fox.

RESOLUTION # 62 TRANSFER OF FUNDS

Trustee Flaherty moved, second by Trustee Astry to transfer funds of \$29,509.84 from Water checking to Reserve for Debt Service for future Capital Improvements in water system. This is in excess from Debt Service Collections and Bond Principal payment due to Refinance Grant from August 2017. VOTE: 4 AYES, 0 NAYS,

DEPUTY CLERK MAZZONE REPORT:

 She inquired if the Fire Department can still purchase gas at Shurefine with new owners. It was stated they can, but the firemen need to get receipts to give to village office.

SUPT. OF PUBLIC WORKS SAM ALAIMO'S REPORT:

 Reported that the Firemen's 1998 tanker did not pass inspection because the frame was cracked. It was caused by rust erosion and frame needs to be repaired. Big D Welding can do repair by replacing frame rails, replace bolts, loosen and scrape rust as soon as Monday and have it returned by Friday at cost of \$3,370. They require 50% of payment to begin work.

RESOLUTION # 63 REPAIR 1998 TANKER

Trustee Astry moved, second by Trustee Krupa to have Big D Welding repair tanker rails, replace bolts, loosen and scrape rust at cost of \$3,370 with down payment of \$1,685.00. VOTE: 4 AYES, 0 NAYS.

TRUSTEE ASTRY'S REPORT:

- He reported that the Utility Worker and Landscaping maintenance person for Seasonal Labor that we voted to hire at last meeting both decided not to take the positions.
- He reported that they received 1 application for Utility Worker, Sean Szukala and has a CDL license. He is a solid candidate, good work experience, can weld, repair vehicles. He will need to give a 2 week notice to employer. The interview was conducted by himself, Mayor Dorman and Sam Alaimo.
- They received one application for Landscaping maintenance person for Seasonal Labor Worker. They interviewed Bob Frank who is retiring from his County position and is willing to work as the

- seasonal worker. This will be a seasonal position for mowing, leaf and brush pickup, trash pickup and custodial and maintenance.
- He made more repairs at gazebo at beach after more vandalism. This time they went through the window. He put bars on the window to prevent this happening again.

RESOLUTION # 64 HIRE UTILITY WORKER

Trustee Astry moved, second by Trustee Wilson to hire Sean Szukala at rate of \$17.50 per hour, eligible for enrollment for health insurance after 30 days, retirement and a 1-year probation. VOTE: 4 AYES, 0 NAYS.

HIRE LANDSCAPING MAINTENANCE SEASONAL PART TIME PERSON Trustee Astry moved, second by Trustee Flaherty to hire Robert Frank as part time Landscaping Maintenance person at rate of \$ 15.00 per hour. VOTE: 4 AYES, 0 NAYS.

TRUSTEE FLAHERTY'S REPORT:

- Thanked Trustee Astry for fixing window at gazebo.
- Thanked Trustee Mark Wilson, Mayor Dorman, Sam Alaimo and Bob York for helping with Clean Up on April 24th. If we decide to do it next year, we should have 1 dumpster for scrap metal.
- The Maple Ave Academy students raked the beach this morning.
- She had a portable potty delivered at beach for May 1st through October 1st.
- There is a CAP run scheduled from beach on May 15th so bathrooms will need to be ready by then.
- She reported that the artist that will be doing mural at JoJo's will starting on Monday.

TRUSTEE KRUPA'S REPORT:

 She reported that the flowers that she planted are doing great and if anyone has hanging baskets that they don't need she would appreciate them.

TRUSTEE WILSON REPORT:

- He reported that the Beer Mile for the fundraiser for Fire Department is going well, need to have more publicity to promote it. Observer reporter will be doing article and will ask for other Fire Departments to send personnel.
- The Running Festival for the Library scheduled for May 30th has 100 people registered from 7 states. The Library committee is doing great with sponsors.
- Reported that Scott Bristol and Justin O'Brien are willing to help people put boats in water if DEC boat launch isn't built soon.
